

Sample Questions for an Interview with Major Davis

Family and Brief Military Background

1. Major Davis, can you tell me more about your hometown and family background?
2. Did your father serve in the military? If so, what branch of service? And did he fight in WWII or the Korean War?
3. Do you have any brothers and sisters that serve in the Military?
4. Did any of your uncles serve in World War I or II?
5. I understand you're a Howard University alumni? Is that where you met your wife?
6. Did you get married before or after you joined the Air Force?
7. How long have you been married? How many children do you have? So, your wife has been a "Military Wife" for quite a while...?
8. Did any of your children join the military? If so, what branch of service?
9. I understand you served in the Vietnam war? What was your job?
10. When you returned back into the United States, how did you get the assignment to serve in the Joint Chiefs of Staff at the Pentagon.
11. What was your job at the Joint Chiefs of Staff?
12. I understand you provided an escort for Coretta Scott King, can you tell us more about that?

About the Case (Davis v. Rettig)

1. Tell us about your federal case, *Davis v. Rettig*? Who is Rettig?
2. I'm confused, please explain why you think of your case as a civil rights case and not a regular tax case?
3. Tell us about the "PNC Bank" incident?
4. Did this also happen to your retirement account?
5. What about your social security account?
6. How long have these garnishments been going on? And how has it affected your health and welfare? How is your wife handling these matters? Was her financial accounts also garnished?

A Legal Remedy and Approach

1. What is the legal remedy?
2. What eventually turned your case around?
3. I understand you received a copy of a Whistleblower Disclosure document? Can you tell us more about it?
4. How is your attorney helping you with this matter? Can anyone file an IRC 7433 administrative claim?
5. Is your U.S. Congressman aware that this is happening to you and your wife? Have you reached out to your congressman? What was his response?
